

## **PBA Campus Safety & Security**

### *Safety Tips for your student*

Campus Safety & Security patrols 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year. If you have a question, concern, or see something suspicious, call 561-803-2500 to report the information. Things we may want to know are: Your location or the location of the suspicious activity or person, a description of the person, a bicycle or vehicle description, the direction of travel the suspicious person is heading.

\*Download the RAVE/GUARDIAN App, and familiarize yourself with its features. Note the safety timer on the main page that can be set up with friends and family from your contact list.

\*Register your bike at Campus Safety & Security within the first week. Always secure your bike with a U bolt lock at a designated bicycle rack when not in use.

\*Keep your vehicle locked and your car alarm on. Visit your vehicle more than once a week, and never leave things out in the open inside the vehicle such as phones, purses, chargers, etc.

\*Don't leave items unattended in the library, dining hall, etc., such as cell phones, laptops, or bicycles.

\*Practice situational awareness at all times. Here are tips to help keep you safe:

\*Lock your room door. Never prop open any exterior door on campus!

\*Request a courtesy escort if you need to travel around the campus alone after dark, including the early morning hours. This can be done by calling Campus Safety & Security at 561-803-2500 or through the RAVE/GUARDIAN app, accessed through the submit tip tile.

\*Always be conscious of your surroundings, taking note of who and what is around you. If you see something, say something.

\*Travel in pairs and use routes that are well lit and populated. Avoid dark and secluded areas.

\*Ear/Air pods are distracting. If you are moving (i.e. walking, biking, skateboarding) take them out so you are able to hear what is occurring around you.

\*Learn the locations of the blue light call boxes located strategically around the campus. Each box has the ability to call Campus Safety & Security directly or 911.

\*Report concerning behavior through Waypoint which can be accessed on MyPBA.

\*Attend any meetings or training opportunities offered by Campus Safety & Security.

\*Trust your intuition - if it doesn't feel right, it probably isn't!
