

SAILFISH SAFE

President Schwinn announced classes will resume this fall, and shared a full plan for extensive safety measures to be in place when students return. A few notable measures being taken are listed below.

Some highlights from PBA's plan include:

- Face masks must be worn by all PBA community members while on campus.
- Daily wellness checks are required for all faculty, staff, students, vendors or visitors prior to University access.
- PBA community members are expected to adhere to personal prevention practices by physical distancing and healthy hand hygiene. University facilities will be cleaned regularly and disinfected according to CDC recommendations.
- PBA has reserved a limited number of single rooms to be available to students at an additional cost on a first-come, first-served basis.
- Residence Life has set aside existing apartments for quarantine or isolation.
- Classes are being assessed for movement to larger classrooms to allow for physical distancing.
- Considerations will be made for sick faculty, staff and students that encourage a remote environment when necessary due to illness.
- Classrooms are being enhanced for remote teaching and learning.
- Class sizes and densities as well as non-traditional spaces are being evaluated in consideration of the current CDC, state and local physical distancing guidelines.
- Traditional undergraduate courses and some graduate courses will finish the fall semester's face-to-face instruction before the Thanksgiving holiday.
